What is awesome about this trip?

The Relationships.

This trip focuses on three relationships: community, church and Christ. During the trip, participants will invest heavily in the community as they meet people from the Lake Traverse Reservation. All the work projects focus on getting work done, and making meaningful connections to the people we serve. Participants will also develop much closer relationships with this church group as we spend time together serving, worshipping, learning, and playing. We serve others because we are responding to God's love, and our relationship with God deepens as we serve.

The Experience.

The reason so many students attend mission trips every summer is simple... it changes them. A week of mission trip redirects the way we think about ourselves and the way we see needs in a community. The trip is an excuse for us to get away from the normal boredom of the summer and do something meaningful. We change the world, and in the process, God changes us. At the conclusion of our trip we'll invite parents, friends, and families to a welcome home celebration event we call "story sharing". During this time our trip participants tell their God stories from their week of mission. Even though they are exhausted, their raw experiences are a treasure that needs to be shared with their friends and families.



What is different about the trip this year?

The Work.

In partnership with Group Workcamps, students will be divided into teams and matched up with a family in the Red Lake area to help with home repair. Home repair varies from site to site; students can expect to contribute by painting, building decks or wheelchair ramps, weatherizing, or repairing existing structures. Home repair mission trips offer a unique experience as students form deep relationships with the family that they serve.

The Transportation.

Can you say chartered bus? For the first time, our entire team of students will be able to ride to Red Lake as ONE team. The bus allows our students to be a unified team as we travel north in style, and it means that our leaders will have plenty of rest!

The Size. This year we will send our largest group of high school students from Prairie Lutheran. Combined with 15 other churches and more than 400 youth, this mission trip is big and will make a big impact on the Red Lake Indian Reservation this summer. Bigger size means more leadership opportunities, connections to students in other churches and deeper relationships within our own group. All of our youth will be placed in separate work groups during the day and will have time together in the evenings during free time and church time.
